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REPORT ON STATUS OF FETAL & INFANT DEATHS IN NORTHEAST FLORIDA TO BE RELEASED, ANNOUNCEMENT OF FUNDING COLLABORATIVE TO REVIEW ALL DEATHS

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. – The Northeast Florida Annual Fetal & Infant Mortality Review Community Meeting will be held Oct. 18 at 10 a.m. at the Kids Hope Alliance (1095 A. Philip Randolph Blvd., Jacksonville) to address the state of maternal and child health in the region and announce new collaborative funding of the first full review of fetal and infant deaths in the region. The meeting is hosted by the Northeast Florida Healthy Start Coalition.

FIMR aims to reduce infant mortality by gathering and reviewing detailed information to gain a better understanding of fetal and infant deaths in Northeast Florida. The project examines cases with the worst outcomes to identify gaps in maternal and infant services and to promote future improvements. The Coalition began the review in 1995 and has continued to carry it out with funding from the Florida Department of Health to review 28 deaths annually. This funds only a fraction of the 250+ fetal and infant deaths in the region each year.
