## MEDIA ADVISORY: National Health Corps Florida AmeriCorps Members to Serve on King Holiday

Members to participate in group service projects as part of National Day of Service

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. — Twenty-five National Health Corps Florida AmeriCorps members serving in Northeast Florida will step up to serve as volunteers on the annual Martin Luther King Jr. Holiday. The members, who had already dedicated a year of service at local public health organizations, will participate in activities organized by the United Way of Northeast Florida. They will start the day with a rally at Edward Waters College and then split up to either work on a neighborhood garden or assemble backpacks for children, joining hundreds of thousands of Americans across the country in volunteer service.

National Health Corps Florida is participating in a day of service that will leverage the strength of local citizens to help tackle local problems and advance Dr. King's dream of opportunity for all. The annual event honors Dr. King's legacy and is an opportunity for Americans to renew their own personal vows of civic responsibility through service to others and engage in conversations to advance community goals.

**WHO:** National Health Corps Florida AmeriCorps Members. National Health Corps members commit to providing 1700 hours of service over a 46-week term of service in Northeast Florida. Each member is placed within a local organization and fulfills the majority of their service at their site through activities such as conducting health outreach, teaching health education classes, and helping enrolling people in health insurance and pharmaceutical assistance programs.

**WHAT:** Neighborhood Garden: Members will help revitalize a local garden by planting, landscaping and building raised garden beds.

Northwest Jacksonville CDC: Members will assemble backpacks with books and school supplies to be distributed to 500 kids.
